Kindergarten Transition Form time is here!

During the month of May, the Birth to 3rd Grade Partnership will be sending out Kindergarten Transition Forms to all center directors in Cambridge. These forms connect a child's preschool teacher to the child's Junior Kindergarten or Kindergarten teacher in Cambridge Public Schools. Sharing the child's strengths and needs means that the child is known as an individual before the start of school. This sharing of information will benefit the child, the family, and the educator during this critical transition period.

Please be on the lookout for these forms and more detailed information. The transition form will be sent via email, along with instructions on how to complete and submit it. With your help, we hope to reach our goal of having a completed Transition Form for every child entering Junior Kindergarten or Kindergarten next year.
